- 1. Have there been times when you have neglected the influence of God's Word in your life and sensed yourself "drifting" from God?
- 2. How have you personally benefited from God's Word?
- 3. We discovered that Ezra had God's hand upon him. Would you agree that having God's hand on you is a good definition of success? Do you believe that if someone were to regularly read and apply God's Word that they would likely grow in their relationship with God?
- 4. Ezra 7:9-10 indicates that having God's hand on you and being devoted to God's Word go hand-in-hand. Do you feel a devotion to God's Word?
- 5. Ezra reveals that devotion to God's Word means reading it and being changed by what we read. Knowledge without obedience leads to a big head instead of a burning heart. How can you encourage yourself to both read and be changed by God's Word?
